



This Indenture made this 18th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and twenty nine Between Henry Bartlett of Halifax County of the one part and Thomas Whittlock of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Henry Bartlett for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve hundred Dollars

of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Thomas Whittlock the receipt whereof the said Henry Bartlett doth hereby confess and acknowledge and doth hereby acquit and discharge the said Thomas Whittlock by these presents he the said Henry Bartlett doth grant bargain sell alien assign and confirm unto the said Thomas Whittlock and his heirs and assigns forever one certain Tract or parcel of land situate lying and being on both sides of Lawson's Creek in the County of Halifax aforesaid containing three hundred acres and is bounded as followeth to wit beginning at a certain oak tree standing fifty two degrees East two hundred and twenty one poles easting Lawson's Creek to the same thence North fifty five degrees East two hundred poles to a light house the same and pointing thence North thirty seven degrees West two hundred and twenty poles to a light house stake and pointing on Ebenezer's line thence on his line South fifty two degrees West ninety four poles to his corner which oak thence South twenty four degrees West thirty seven poles to a pine thence South twenty degrees West one hundred and twenty one poles to the beginning and all trees woods ways water courses then contained on the profits commodities advantages benefits and other whatsoever which some to the same belonging or in anywise appertaining or then in Equity upon the said Henry Bartlett and his heirs of or into the said Tract or parcel of land upon the premises with the appertinances to have and to hold the said Tract or parcel of land and premises with the appertinances unto the said Thomas Whittlock his heirs and assigns forever and the said Henry Bartlett do hereby and his heirs doth further warrant and grant to and with the said Thomas Whittlock that he the said Henry Bartlett and his heirs the said Tract or parcel of land and premises above mentioned with the appertinances unto the said Thomas Whittlock his heirs and assigns against the said Henry Bartlett and his heirs and against the claim or claims of all other any person or persons whatsoever shall and shall warrant and defend by these presents in Writs whereof the said Henry Bartlett hath bene made sole he here or any other in that the day and year above written,
